

#### **Session Notes**

#### August 15, 2023—

The meeting was called to order by Moderator John Baker, who opened with verses from Proverbs 3:1-9. This passage includes the well-known admonishment "in all thy ways acknowledge him and he shall direct thy paths.".

After prayer, Clerk Cathy MacRae announced there was a quorum for the meeting. The initial item of business was to establish a nominating committee for 2023. Cheryl Bacon volunteered to be the chair. (A nominating committee has since been approved by the congregation.) Two elder positions are up for replacement this year.

Committee reports: Gene Frazelle from Budget and Finance announced that the 2022 operating books had been audited and found to be in good order. The auditing committee included Gene, Linda Seiberling and Kathy Oldham. Kathy's Treasurer's report included January-July and the financial details of the mission trip to West Virginia. The donations for the trip exceeded expenses.

Kathy pointed out that Worship Committee expenses had exceeded income. After discussion about transferring funds from another account to cover the difference, Gene opined that overspending is not a problem as long as the overall budget is in good shape. We will be under budget for the year because of the pastor we are not paying. Kathy said she is reimbursing mileage for people who travel more than 100 miles round trip to preach us. We also may need a line item in the budget for the PNC.

Terry Keith was absent but sent an account of recent activity for Buildings and Grounds, which included completion of the

painting, the installation of a new bulletin board in the hallway and a new rack for cleaning supplies. A continuing issue with the sound system is being addressed.

Dawn Barber reported that the Fellowship Committee helped Mary Rush welcome the mission team. Fellowship will provide refreshments for a musical event Oct. 21. Cheryl Bacon said that the Member Care Committee will have a meeting in September; date TBA.

Karen Keith was absent but sent a report that the Mission and Outreach Committee will sponsor a spaghetti dinner September 9 at 5 p.m. Friend to Friend will send a speaker to discuss their programs in Moore County; other churches will be involved in this event.

Linda Seiberling was absent but sent a report that the roster of supply ministers is filled through the end of December. Reverend Jim Bumgardner will be our minister on Christmas Eve.

Terry's report,ed that the Pastor Nominating Committee continues their work in searching for a new minister. The Presbytery computer program has changed and he has been working to update our information to meld with their system.

John Baker, in his Moderator's Report, said there are 23 open jobs in the West Community of the Coastal Carolina Presbytery. There will be a meeting of the West Community September 23 from 9-12 at Community Presbyterian in Pinehurst. With no other business to discuss, John gave a closing prayer and the elders dispersed into the hot, humid summer night.
